My background in architecture, theatre and visual arts feeds into my work experience with the urban: From large scale (Oresund region) to a local scale - facilitating processes that strengthen weak communities (social housing in the suburbs of Copenhagen). Present work is a constellation of praxis and theory - an "active space" - that combines my artistic background and experiences from work in vulnerable neighbourhoods with elements from participatory performance, pervasive games and psychogeography. The aim is to unleash an overlooked source for political transformations embodied in a non verbal, radical openness of the urban.
