

As part of the agreement with the Danish state the process that has existed on Christiania was to be complemented with the Danish legal framework


The diagram below shows how the existing Christiania process - that would give a green light for people to renovate, expand an existing house or build a new house - has been cut into two parts to include the formal planning process that exists in the rest of Denmark. The existing process had a decision making process that was very close to the people involved or affected by the proposed building. The meeting minutes were published in the weekly Christiania newspaper "Ugespejlet" (the weekly mirror) to ensure transparency.

Combining the existing CA process and formal Danish process leads to a very complex and demanding job for the people in the local Christiania "byggekontor" (building office). Before the agreement the drawings could be less formal and fixed. Now it is a job for professionals to draw a project to send to authorities and the projects are far more fixed with less room for improvisation and a personal touch so central to the build culture on Christiania.
